8. Approval of Contributed Funds Agreement with USBR for Completion of NBWRA Phase 2 Environmental Compliance

The Board reviewed the purpose of the agreement and noted that funds have been included in the SCWA Phase 2 administrative budget. A motion by Vice Chair Techel, seconded by Director Gorin, to approve the Contributed Funds Agreement with USBR for Completion of NBWRA Phase 2 Environmental Compliance was unanimously approved.

9. Report on Revisions to the Memorandum of Understanding

The Program Manager reported that all ten member agencies have approved and signed the 4th Revised Memorandum of Understanding, with an effective date of November 15, 2017. All signed copies have been received and two set of original signatures from each member agency have been provided to member agency representatives at today's meeting.

10. Program Development, Federal, and State Advocacy Update

Ginger Bryant reported that the next Funding Opportunity Announcement is expected in January 2018. She noted that the first Phase 2 application was not approved. She discussed the projects that were approved. She and The Ferguson Group have been working with USBR to revise the

selection criteria to make projects such as those from NBWRA are more competitive. The next application will be for approximately \$4 million and will include City of Petaluma and probably two other projects. Lastly she noted that the next trip to Washington D.C. is planned for January 2018.

Pilar Oñate-Quintana provided a summary of State Advocacy activities, including legislative efforts for long-term water conservation mandates. Two bills did not pass but will likely resurface in the next session. She discussed SB5, Parks Bond, which if approved by the voters in June 2018 would provide \$80 million for recycled water funding. A November 2018 water funding initiative would provide \$400 million for recycled water purposes. She also noted that AB574 (Quirk) and SB231 (Hertzberg) were both signed by the Governor. SB 623 (Monning) is a water tax to pay for small water system issues is expected to be picked up again in 2018. Lastly she discussed a very successful tour for Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry on September 25, 2017.

11. Engineering, Environmental, and Public Involvement Services Report

Mike Savage an update on the status of the Phase 2 Feasibility Report. He also noted that they are providing support for the development of the EIR/EIS. They are also preparing for the next construction grant application that will likely begin in January 2018.

Jim O'Toole provided a summary of the plans for completing the Phase 2 EIR/EIS by June 2018. The Notice of Intent was filed on November 6, 2017. Draft sections of the EIR/EIS are out for internal review and will go to the member agencies in mid-December 2018. He highlighted the key issues and schedule and noted that public meetings to receive comment will occur in February 2018. Once comments are addressed the final EIR/EIS will go to the member agencies for approval.

Mark Millan discussed public outreach and communication issues. His team will be coordinating public notification for the public comment meetings in February 2018. He also noted that the Recycled Water Science Advisory Panel will be holding a meeting in Sacramento on December 15, 2017 on constituents of Emerging Concern (CECs). The meeting will be held at the Joe Serna, Jr. Cal EPA Headquarters Building, Klamath Training Room, 2nd Floor 1001 I Street, Sacramento, CA 95814. The meeting will also be webcast at https://stateofcaswrcbweb.centurylinkccc.com/CenturylinkWEb/SimoneHalbert.

12. NorthBay WATER

Ginger Bryant described the NorthBay WATER program and noted that there will be a series of meetings from January to May 2018 to assess interest and develop an organizational structure and financing mechanisms. There was discussion as to the purpose of the new program, which will focus on all possible water issues, including groundwater, salt management, stormwater, and others that may be of interest to the participants. A variety of federal and state funding options will also be sought.

• WIIN Act Implementation.—TFG continued work on implementation of the federal drought relief legislation adopted as part of the "Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act" (S. 612). Among other things, the WIIN Act included \$50 million to support the construction of currently unauthorized water reuse and recycling projects, which creates a clear opportunity for funding Phase 2 of the North Bay program. As reported earlier, TFG worked with the authors of the WIIN Act Title XVI provisions and Reclamation to ensure that North Bay's Phase 2 project would be deemed eligible to compete for the available FY 2017 funding.

During the month of November, TFG also participated in numerous meetings and calls with stakeholders and congressional staff regarding the deficiencies in the WIIN Act Finding Opportunity Analysis (FOA) and the FOA's inability to allow for the equitable consideration of the benefits of different types of water recycling projects and programs. TFG met Reclamation's Washington staff and participated in a conference call with Reclamation's Washington and Denver staff on the issue regarding North Bay's concerns regarding the implementation of the new WIIN Act authority. TFG also participated in a separate conference call with Title XVI advocates and the Denver Reclamation office implementing the program to discuss concerns about WIIN Act Title XVI authority implementation and upcoming FY 2018 Title XVI Funding Opportunity Announcement.

- **Phase 2 Authorization.**—TFG continued work on options to address the Phase 2 authorization ambiguities.
- **Fiscal Year 2018 Appropriations.**—TFG continued to advocate for robust funding levels in the FY 2018 appropriations process for water reuse/recycling, WaterSMART grants under the Bureau of Reclamation and Trump Administration plans for advancing federal support for non-federal infrastructure, including water resources infrastructure. Meetings were held in October to advocate for higher funding levels for Title XVI, and, as noted above, to seek approval of language in the FY 2018 appropriations process that addresses North Bay Water Reuse Authority's concerns regarding implementation of the WIIN Act Title XVI authority. TFG also worked with the Authority to draft correspondence to Senator Dianne Feinstein and Representative Ken Calvert outlining these concerns and providing recommended language

for the omnibus that would help address these concerns. Recommended language options include the following:

Draft Statement of Managers Language Energy and Water Development and Related Agencies Appropriations Bill for Fiscal Year 2018

At the appropriate place in the statement of managers, add the following:

Option 1:

WaterSMART Program: Title XVI Water Reclamation & Reuse Program.—Of the funding provided for this program, no less than \$10,000,000 shall be available for water recycling and reuse projects as authorized in section 4009(c) of Public Law 114-322, and the Secretary is directed to review the technical proposal evaluation criteria in future funding opportunity announcements associated with such authority to ensure that a diversity of water recycling projects, including small-scale, single purpose projects, large-scale urban projects, and regional, watershed-based projects, are able to equitably compete for funding.

Option 2:

WaterSMART Program: Title XVI Water Reclamation & Reuse Program.—Of the funding provided for this program, no less than \$10,000,000 shall be available for water recycling and reuse projects as authorized in section 4009(c) of Public Law 114-322, and the Secretary is directed to review the technical proposal evaluation criteria in future funding opportunity announcements associated with such authority to ensure that a diversity of water recycling projects are able to equitably compete for funding.

Specifically, the meetings focused on building support for changes to the implementation of the federal drought relief legislation adopted as part of the "Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation (WIIN) Act" (S. 612). Among other things, the WIIN Act included \$50 million to support the construction of currently unauthorized water reuse and recycling projects, which creates a clear opportunity for funding Phase 2 of the North Bay program. As reported earlier, TFG worked with the authors of the WIIN Act Title XVI provisions and the Bureau of Reclamation (Reclamation) to ensure that North Bay's Phase 2 project would be deemed eligible to compete for the available FY 2017 funding. The meetings also focused on the need for Reclamation to make changes to the FY 2018 WIIN Act Funding Opportunity Analysis (FOA) to allow for the equitable consideration of the benefits of different types of water recycling projects and programs as well as to urge accelerated funding for the WIIN Act authorized Title XVI projects, like the Authority's Phase 2 project.
- Fiscal Year 2018 and 2019 Appropriations.—TFG continued to advocate for robust funding levels in the FY 2018 appropriations process for water reuse/recycling, WaterSMART grants under the Bureau of Reclamation and Trump Administration plans for advancing federal support for non-federal infrastructure, including water resources infrastructure. In the Washington meetings, the Authority also advocated for higher funding levels for Title XVI, and, as noted above, the Authority urged approval of language in the FY 2018 appropriations process that addresses North Bay Water Reuse Authority's concerns regarding implementation of the WIIN Act Title XVI authority. In addition, the Authority advocated for \$50 million to be allocated to Title XVI implementation in the FY 2019 appropriations process.

Long-Term Water Conservation Mandates Status of Legislative Efforts

 ◆ After months of discussion and several bills in 2017 related to post 20 x 20 x 20 conservation requirements, Senate and Assembly legislative staff focused on a merged proposal for requirements.

On the final night of session, the companion bills SB 606 (Hertzberg) and AB 1668 (Friedman) – supported by both the Governor and the SWRCB – failed to pass. There were water agencies on both sides.

Long-Term Water Conservation Mandates Status of Legislative Efforts

WateReuse took a support position on the conservation legislation after amends to provide credit for potable reuse and some protections for nonpotable water recycling. (Additional detail regarding key aspects of the measures was provided in December presentation.)

SB 5 – Parks (and some Water) Bond – and Memai 10 effort
