4. Introductions

Introductions of the Board were made.

5. Board Meeting Minutes of October 22, 2018.

On a motion by Director Baker, seconded by Director Gorin, the minutes of the October 22, 2018 meeting were unanimously approved by the Board.

6. Election of Officers

The Memorandum of Understanding requires that the Board elect a Chair and Vice Chair at its first meeting of each calendar year. Director Gibson motioned, seconded by Director Long to nominate David Rabbitt for Chair and Jill Techel for Vice Chair for 2019. The motion was unanimously approved by the Board.

7. Report from the Chair

a. Consultant Progress Reports

The Board reviewed the consultant progress reports for October, November, and December 2018.

b. Financial Reports

The Board reviewed the Final Financial Reports for Fiscal Year 2018/19 through December 31, 2018. Through the second quarter of the year all expenses are tracking normally.

8. Phase 1: Status of Reconciliation and Closeout Activities

Mike Savage gave a brief report on this item. Phase 1 Member Agency financial reconciliation is underway. Grant and project close out activities will be more fully discussed under Agenda Item No. 10.

9. Phase 2: Consultant Reports

Ginger Bryant reported on Phase 2 Implementation activities to support Phase 2 projects and securing state and federal funding assistance for the \$72.5M in Phase 2 projects. She described issues related to a new Congress and Legislature. Her team will be addressing funding in two stages; first is appropriations and the "language fix" to the Phase 2 authorization allowing funds to be earmarked under the "Legacy Project" account, which would provide a larger source of funding. The second stage would focus on amendments to the WIIN Act to disaggregate sections related to Title XVI to make it easier to secure grant funds, extending the term of the WIIN program by 10-years and increasing the funding to \$50M annually. She also noted that there is a possibility, yet to be fully evaluated, to incorporate projects into CalTrans stormwater TMDL funding.

Pilar Oñate-Quintana provided a summary of the November statewide election. There is a new Governor and Democrats have a super majority in both the Senate and Assembly. She also summarized key committee membership assignments and the Governor's Office staff appointments. Emerging water issues include a Governor supported drinking water tax, recycled water funding under Prop. 68, and the reemergence of ocean discharge limitations, which would impact NWBRA wastewater agencies. Drew McIntyre asked about other possible appointments by the Governor, including the State Water Board. The Chair is up for reappointment and should be supported by NBWRA. There is also another vacancy on the State Water Board.

Rene Guillen provided a summary of engineering support activities. Melanie Tan provided an update on the financial capability analysis. A draft will be submitted to the agencies for review by the end of January 2019. Following a review period, the draft will be submitted to USBR in March 2019.

Jim O'Toole provided an update on the status of the EIR/EIS. The Waiver needed to complete Reclamation review and publish the ROD is still needing approval from the Commissioner's office. The primary issue is the number of pages and efforts are being made to seek a Waiver. Plan B, discussed and approved at the October 22, 2018 meeting has not been implemented as Reclamation advised against it due to no significant change in the project, so there is still money for ESA available to completed the task once Reclamation provides direction and processes the Waiver. Ginger Bryant outlined plans and options to move this issue forward in an upcoming meeting with the Commissioner's office.

Mark Millan updated the Board on public outreach activities, which are largely related to the EIR/EIS process. He also discussed the upcoming WateReuse Conference in Orange County March 17-19, 2019.

Jake Spaulding gave an update on the IRWM Grant. The group is working through various issues as there are more projects than available funding.

10. Beyond June 2019: Phase 1 Closeout and Phase 2 Implementation

Mike Savage reported that he has retired from B&C and continues to provide support to NBWRA as a subconsultant to Data Instincts. He provided a summary and timeline of activities required to close out Phase 1 and implement Phase 2. Closing out Phase 1 includes required audit activities from USBR. A final report must be submitted to USBR before the term of the agreement with USBR ends on September 30, 2020. Chuck Weir summarized the options for Phase 1 agencies, not participating in Phase 2, once all Phase 1 activities have been completed. They could withdraw from NBWRA or become an Associate Member. Phase 2 activities will require federal and state advocacy to ensure funding; program administration and fiscal agent, and program support services.

Over the course of the construction of Phase 1 projects, some project titles were changed from what was originally submitted to USBR. The final list will need to be updated. Jake Spaulding will send out the spreadsheet for the member agencies to update.

Ginger Bryant summarized needed activities to assist the agencies in funding and completing Phase 2 projects. Since her agreement ends on June 30, 2019, a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) will need to go out soon to ensure services can be provided beginning July 1, 2019. She suggested an 18-month timeframe to coincide with the federal and state legislative sessions. She also noted that the anticipated time to close out Phase 1 would be on the order of 18 months, and the implementation of Phase 2 is six to eight years.

Jake Spaulding summarized the engineering services agreement and noted that is currently extends through October 30, 2019. There is adequate funding for all activities provided by the B&C team to extend beyond that date. He indicated that with no change in the agreement amount it could be administratively extended.

11. Discussion and Direction: Phase 1 Closeout and Phase 2 Implementation

Chair Rabbitt led a discussion on the need for an RFQ to cover an 18-month timeframe and that it be coordinated with the member agencies. The Water Agency would issue the RFQ. Vice Chair Techel asked that the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) be included in the process. The number of future meetings was also discussed. Chuck Weir noted that the Board reviews financial statements and must approve the annual budget and that in the past it has also approved consultant agreements and the process for applying for grants. He noted that some of those tasks could be delegated to the TAC and that the total number of meetings could likely be reduced. Mike Savage stated that there are adequate remaining funds in the B&C agreement to cover all the B&C team's activities, including engineering, environmental and outreach for an 18-month period from now through June 30, 2020.

Director Long noted that his agency is nearing completion of their Phase 1 projects, has adequate recycled water to meet the needs of the water agencies and that his agency would likely become an Associate Member at the completion of Phase 1.

Following discussion, the Board approved the following items:

- 1. A motion by Director Gibson, seconded by Director Gorin to extend the B&C agreement through June 30, 2020 was unanimously approved.
- 2. A motion by Director Gorin, seconded by Director Rodoni to authorize Sonoma County Water Agency to work with the Member Agencies to issue a Request for Qualifications for Program Development, Federal Advocacy, and State Advocacy for the period July 1, 2019 to December 31, 2020 was unanimously approved.

Both items will be brought back to the Board at the April 22, 2019 meeting for final approval. At that meeting a firm will be recommended based on the RFQ process for an 18-month agreement to be effective July 1, 2019. The agreement will include the full scope of services and meeting schedule.

12. Items for Future Discussion and Comments from Chair, Board, or Member Agencies Items for the next meeting include: regular business reports, Status Reports on Phase 1 and Phase 2 activities, final approval of the no-cost agreement extension for B&C, and a recommendation

to enter into an 18-month agreement with the firm selected through the RFQ process for Program Development, State Advocacy, and Federal Advocacy.

13. Adjournment

Chair Rabbitt adjourned the meeting at 11:22 a.m. The next meeting will be Monday, April 22, 2019 at 9:30 a.m. at Novato City Hall.

Among other options, TFG continued discussions with lawmakers and those in the Title XVI community about adjusting the \$20 million cap by the rate of inflation, as mandated in the 1996 Title XVI amendments, thereby increasing the per project cap to more than \$32 million (Bureau of Labor Statistics Inflation Calculator).

- **▲** LGVSD is currently constructing the final Phase 1 project
- ◆ Phase 1 and 2 tour with USBR will be on May 2, 2019

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SB 332: Ocean Discharge of Treated Wastewater

- Multiple Financial and Compliance Issues but KEY are:
 - Requires each wastewater treatment facility that discharges through an ocean outfall and affiliated water suppliers to reduce the facility's annual flow as compared to the average annual wastewater discharge baseline volume by at least 50% on or before January 1, 2030, and by at least 95% on or before January 1, 2040.
 - Subjects the owner or operator of a **wastewater treatment facility**, as well as the affiliated **water suppliers**, to a civil **penalty of \$2,000 per acre-foot** of water above the required reduction in overall volume discharge for the failure to meet these deadlines.

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SB 332 Activities to Date

- State Advocacy Activities
 - Ongoing participation with CASA and WateReuse on emerging positions; oppose/oppose unless amended
 - Preliminary outreach to NBWRA representatives and committee staff regarding potential impacts to NBWRA
- Developed Materials for Advocacy Outreach
 - 1-page preliminary summary of technical issues and costs impacts
 - Used existing study information to estimate preliminary impacts in excess of \$500m
 - Even at that cost, discharge limits in the proposed legislation would not be met
 - 1-page summary of NBWRA, region precipitation and subsequent water management issues

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Upcoming SB 332 Activities

- SB 332 moved through the Senate Environmental Quality Committee on April 4 - it will be heard in Senate Judiciary Committee next.
- Sen. Hertzberg staff have noted that this version of the bill is intended as an extreme starter to the conversation, her boss' goal is to come up with something substantive after a lot of input (similar to the recent conservation bills effort)...
- We have initially offered a tour for Hertzberg's staff and will follow up on this educational effort.

FYI – Other WateReuse Sponsored Legislation

▲ AB 1180 (Friedman) - Seeks to require the SWRCB to update the uniform statewide criteria for non potable recycled water uses by January 1, 2023.

▲ AB 292 (Quirk) - Would eliminate the definition of "direct potable reuse" and instead substitute "groundwater augmentation" for "indirect potable reuse for groundwater recharge." Would revise the definition of "treated drinking water augmentation." Require by December 31, 2023 the SWRCB to adopt uniform recycling criteria for raw water augmentation. Would also make conforming changes to other areas relating to potable reuse.

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SB 332 Member Agency Webmeeting

- Outcomes from March 22, 2019 Webmeeting
 - Leah Walker serving as NBWRA rep on WateReuse working group
 - Planning and Engineering team collecting new information regarding potential financial impacts for use in advocacy materials representing NB issues
 - Contributed content for Member Agency email regarding proposed Board action to engage further Planning and Engineering support
 - Submit testimony for record at Senate EQ committee hearing in April

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Identified Need for Additional Planning and Engineering Services

- State and Federal Advocacy Planning and Technical Support
 - Work would be leveraged with Member's information and initiated on an as needed basis
 - Technical support would be used in developing talking points and other materials to support activities in Sacramento and Washington DC
 - Upload key information to the NBWRP webpage

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Proposed RFQ: Planning and Engineering Support Services

- ▲ In response to this discussion, Sonoma Water, acting as the administrative and fiscal agent, investigated the most efficient and time responsive options for member agencies and the Board to consider approving this effort, and proposes the following approach:
 - Sonoma Water will develop an RFQ for the scope of work
 - Sonoma Water will ask the NBWRA Board for authority to enter into an agreement with the selected firm for an amount not to exceed \$25,000
 - Sonoma Water would prepare a new, separate agreement for this work
- **♦** The Board will consider approval under Item 10

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Phase 2 Study: Review

- When Reclamation issues a finding of feasibility, federal funds can be expended on a project
 - Feasibility Study was completed in 2017
 - Financial Capability Analysis will be submitted to USBR May 2019
 - Title XVI grant funds can be applied for and secured at this stage of the process
- ◆ The last Phase 2 Study task is issuance of the Record of Decision (ROD) which completes the environmental review/NEPA process
 - If awarded, Title XVI grant funds cannot be expended until issuance of the ROD

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Phase 2: NEPA Waiver Summary

- ♦ When the NEPA process was nearing completion, new guidance was issued requiring a time/page limit waiver for large, programmatic documents
- ▲ A waiver request was submitted (Sept 2018) but has been placed on *indefinite* hold until there is a federal discretionary action obligating Reclamation to process the waiver
- Discretionary action is attained either through award of federal grant funds or congressional action via legislation
- ◆ Reclamation will process the wavier once directed however, the process will still take an additional 3-6 months before a ROD is issued

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Phase 2: NEPA Waiver Summary

- **♦** Actions to obtain *Discretionary Action:*
 - Appropriation Earmarks members took requests but committee decided to postpone until guidance can be issued next year
 - Authorization Language Fix attached to legislative vehicle working both appropriations and water authorizing bills
 - WIIN Title XVI grant award

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Recommendation for Consideration

▲ In order to conserve contract funds, idle ESA activities until federal discretionary action is attained

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Key Issue 3: Phase 2 Language Fix



Phase 2 Authorization Language Fix

- Phase 2 Authorization 'Language Fix'
 - Final language has been agreed upon
 - Include in appropriations bill or other authorizing vehicle
- **♦** Timing
 - Appropriations bill could be passed in 6-10 months
 - Authorizing bill could be 20-22 months
- How legislative vehicle impacts funding availability
 - If included in appropriations bill, could have waiver completed/ROD issued and, apply for funding under the spring 2020 legacy grant FOA
 - If included in authorizing bill, funding could be delayed until 2022

Title XVI 2020 Appropriations Requests

- **♦** WateReuse requested \$100 million
- ◆ Representative Napolitano's 'dear colleague' letter requested members ask for \$150 million for Title XVI and \$150 million for WaterSMART grants
- ♦ NBWRA requested \$60 million just above the \$58 million appropriated in 2019

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2019 WIIN Act Title XVI Grant Application

- <u>Until</u> the 'language fix' is added to a bill/becomes public law, *NBWRA must* compete under the WIIN Act account
- ◆ The 2019 grant application was not awarded
 - The last two years, NBWRA has been selected by USBR to receive a grant but did not pass the OMB priorities of bigger projects with fast-track, full implementation, and reduced administration costs
 - OMB's decisions are not consistent with USBR guidance and grant award recommendations but do over-ride them
 - Phase 2 agencies are not financially able to go after a "large, complete" project at this time

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2020 WIIN Act Title XVI Grant Application

- Petaluma and American Canyon
 - Are first Phase 2 agencies seeking funding
 - Are not ready to seek over \$6 million in grants that would require \$18 million in local match in the next 2-years
- Petaluma will delay grant application until next year
- Working with American Canyon to determine their preferences

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Key Issue 5: Other Phase 2 Funding



Other Phase 2 Funding Assistance

♦ IRWM

- The Bay Area group will wait for the release of the final PSP before asking for projects (expected late March-early April)
- Should have at least 5-6 weeks to prepare an application
- Caltrans TMDL and Trash Removal Grants
 - Grants are specific to 101 corridor and due to separate storm and wastewater systems, do not qualify

FY 19/20 Budget Summary

- ◆ No new budget was presented at the January 2019 meeting as team members can continue working within existing funds for the next year
 - In support of the above, the Board approved a time only extension to the Brown and Caldwell contract through December 31, 2020
- Program Development and Advocacy is the one activity that needed a new scope/budget beginning July 2019
 - In support of the above, the Board approved and requested:
 - An RFQ solicitation for these services
 - That the recommended consultant, and an accompanying 18-month scope of work and budget, be brought to the Board for consideration at the April 22, 2019 Board meeting
