On a motion by Director Dillon-Knutson, seconded by Director Techel, the minutes of the April 27, 2020 meeting were unanimously approved by the Board by a roll call vote.

6. Report from the Chair

Chair Rabbitt noted that there were no significant issues from the overnight winds and PSPS events. He also noted that the TAC Zoom meeting summaries were included in the packet and asked if thee were any questions.

The Board reviewed the consultant progress reports for the period April - September 2020.

8. Financial Reports for Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2020 and June 30, 2021.

The Board reviewed the financial reports for the periods ending June 30, 2020 and June 30, 2021. Drew McIntyre asked about page 37 in the packet and noted that there was no data for approved budget for FY19/20. The Program Manager noted that there was a small budget approved for FY19/20 and that he would add the data and send a correct page with the draft minutes.

9. Phase 1: Status of Reconciliation and Closeout Activities

Jake Spaulding gave an update on the reconciliation and close out activities for Phase 1. He reported that he would be submitting a performance report to the Bureau for the period ending September 30, 2020 and that there were some remaining funds that could be reallocated to other projects. He will provide a report on that at the February 22, 2021 meeting.

10. Status of Phase 2 EIR/EIS

Jim O'Toole provided an update on the status of the Phase 2 EIR/EIS and noted that there are three potential projects that could be available for WIIN funding and that an addendum could be prepared to make them eligible for WIIN funding with no increase in the budget. Grant Davis asked that in the event SVCSD's 8th Avenue project was not eligible if there were related projects that could be included in the addendum and WIIN application. The Program Manager stated that the Board could approve the recommended action with that modification. Director Rodoni made a motion, seconded by Director Gorin to approve the following: 1) Resolve cost sharing issues to include Marin County's project; 2) Complete an Addendum to the Feasibility Study for additional Phase 2 projects, including options for SVCSD in case the 8th Avenue project is deemed not eligible; and 3) Submit a WIIN application for the appropriate Phase 2 projects.

11. Discussion of Possible New Projects for NBWRA – Groundwater Sustainability, Drought Contingency Plans, and Water Supply Resiliency.

The Board discussed the three potential new projects for NBWRA and offered their support for a detailed workshop for the Board and TAC at the February 21, 2020 Board meeting. It was noted that there may be several new Board members at that time due to the election and retirements. Mark Millan requested that as soon as new Board members are known that he and the Program Manager be notified.

12. Items for the Next Agenda

Chair Rabbitt listed the items for the next agenda that will hopefully be back at Novato City Hall. The items will include the regular reports, Phase 1 and Phase 2 Status Reports, Phase 2 EIR/EIS addendum and WIIN application status, and a discussion of potential new projects for NBWRA.

Director Techel noted that this is her last meeting and that she appreciated the opportunity to serve on the NBWRA Board. Board members thanked Mayor Techel for her many years of public service and wisher her well in her future activities.

ITEM NO. $\underline{10}$ PHASE 1: STATUS OF RECONCILLIATION AND CLOSEOUT ACTIVITIES

Action Requested

None at this time

Summary

Reconciliation and closeout are ongoing as Sonoma Water and Las Gallinas Valley Sanitary District (LGVSD) work to complete the LGVSD Recycled Water Treatment Upgrade project which is the sole remaining Phase 1 project.

The LGVSD Recycled Water Treatment Upgrade project is 95% complete and scheduled for commissioning in August 2020. Once complete Sonoma Water will shift into the final phase of administrative reconciliation working towards full closeout of the grant agreement.

The closeout will include the final reconciliation and cost reallocation as well as submittal of the project closeout report to USBR. The current completion deadline under the grant agreement is March 31, 2021.

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ITEM NO. 11 STATUS OF PHASE 2 EIR/EIS

Action Requested

None at this time

Summary

At the October 26, 2020 meeting, the Board took the following actions: 1) Resolve cost sharing issues to include Marin County's project; 2) Complete an Addendum to the Feasibility Study for additional Phase 2 projects, including options for SVCSD in case the 8th Avenue project is deemed not eligible; and 3) Submit a WIIN application for the appropriate Phase 2 projects. Sonoma Water has revised the description and layout for its effluent line along 7th and 8th Streets in Sonoma. The description and layout are included as **Attachment No. 11.a** and **Attachment No. 11.b** for the Board's information.

The subgroup has been working over the last few months to develop the necessary information such that Marin County can make a decision regarding participation in Phase 2. The key issue is how to incorporate the Marin County project in the cost sharing required by the NBWRA Memorandum of Understanding (MOU). Currently Marin County is an Associate Member, which has annual dues of \$5,000. There have been issues with sending invoices to Marin County, which have now been corrected.

Marin County has been working with Novato Sanitation District on their project and has paid them for some costs associated with Phase 2. Novato San has paid into Phase 2 but has opted to not pursue any Phase 2 Projects. At true-up, some of their costs would be reimbursed. There is precedence for one agency working under another agency. Napa County worked in conjunction with Napa Sanitation District during Phase 1. Napa County paid for some of the Phase 1 costs through a separate arrangement with Napa San. Napa County ultimately became a member of NBWRA and participated in the joint use costs.

A similar arrangement could be used to incorporate Marin County's project in Phase 2. Additional costs for the Phase 2 addendum would likely be covered by Phase 2 payment already made by Novato San once the true up occurs at the completion of Phase 2. At least one party would need to be a full member of NBWRA per the MOU. Novato San desires to drop down to the Associate Member level. Marin County could become a full member and would only need to participate in the joint use costs. Those costs are much lower now that there is no formal lobbying and program development effort. Of course, Marin County is concerned with potential costs, which have not yet been clearly identified. However, all parties believe that a solution can be developed that is fair and equitable to all parties, including current Phase 2 participants.

Staff continue to develop an estimated cost for a Marin County project to be included in Phase 2. It is believed that a Marin County project would be beneficial in the WIIN application and

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subsequent review process. One alternative that is being explored is should the potential benefit to exist Phase 2 agencies from having Marin County participate in a successful WIIN application process result in reduced costs for them to become a full Phase 2 member in NBWRA. This analysis is a work in progress and has not yet been fully resolved.

Another issue is the schedule for a notice from Reclamation that WIIN funding is available. The election complicates this issue as well. Reclamation has indicated that the notice is likely this fall or early in the new year. The next Board meeting is April 19, 2021. It is likely that the notice will be issued prior to that date.

Recommendation

Sonoma Valley CSD (District) Proposed Recycled Water Pipeline Project.

The District has conducted several studies on recycled water distribution in Sonoma Valley. The District is looking to increase its resiliency in supplying recycled water to its users and continuing to assist in the reduction of over drafting of the groundwater in the area by updating the existing pipeline which is nearing the end of its useful life. The existing pipeline was constructed in 1959 as a gravity reinforce concrete pipeline, then converted to a pressurized pipeline in about 1966 and eventually lined in the mid 90's. This project will help provide the District and its users with resiliency in its ability to supply recycled water for wetland restoration (Napa-Sonoma Salt Ponds Restoration Project); wetlands habitat for winter migration (District's Management Units and Dept. Fish and Wildlife upland ponds); and, agricultural users (vineyard, pasturelands, and dairies) while facing unknown climate change in California.

The project would consist of a installing approximately 5,000 feet of new 24-inch diameter PVC pipeline that would parallel the existing effluent line from the District's Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP) to the District's B1 pump station. The new effluent pipeline would run from the existing effluent meter within the WWTP, then head east along the WWTP access road, then south down 8th Street East; then east on State Highway 12 crossing under the existing rail road tracks, then south down an existing gravel access road to the District's B1 Pump station. The existing pipeline would be abandoned in place.

The Coalition will be holding a conference call on March 8, 2021 to receive updates on the Governor's budget, the political landscape in Sacramento, bond and policy bill introductions and discuss opportunities for Coalition engagement. ITEM NO. <u>13</u> DISCUSSION OF POSSIBLE NEW PROJECTS FOR NBWRA – GROUNDWATER SUSTAINABILITY, DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLANS, AND WATER SUPPLY RESILIENCY

Action Requested

None at this time.

Summary

At the October 26, 2020 Board meeting, the Board discussed the three potential new projects for NBWRA and offered their support for a detailed workshop for the Board and TAC at the February 21, 2021 Board meeting. It was noted that there may be several new Board members at that time due to the November 2020 election and retirements. Due to the impacts of COVID-19, efforts to resolve Phase 1 and Phase 2 issues, and other priorities, not much effort has gone into developing a workshop for the Board on these items. The Board should continue its discussion of these items and provide direction for Sonoma Water and the consultant team. Where does the Board envision NBWRA heading in the next few years? Some background information on the three issues is provided below.

<u>Groundwater Sustainability</u>. The <u>Sustainable Groundwater Management Act (SGMA)</u> requires local public agencies and <u>Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSAs)</u> in <u>high- and medium-priority basins</u> to develop and implement Groundwater Sustainability Plans (GSPs) or Alternatives to GSPs. GSPs are detailed road maps for how groundwater basins will reach long term sustainability.

<u>Drought Contingency Plans</u>. A drought contingency plan is a strategy or combination of strategies for monitoring the progression of a drought and preparing a response to potential water supply shortages resulting from severe droughts or other water supply emergencies.

<u>Water Supply Resiliency</u>. Governor Newsom recently signed an <u>executive order</u> to develop a comprehensive strategy for making the state's water system climate-resilient. The order calls for a broad portfolio of collaborative strategies to deal with outdated water infrastructure, unsafe drinking water, flood risks and depleted groundwater aquifers. Water recycling would clearly be a key strategy to any strategy.

Recommendation

There is no formal recommendation at this time, other than to continue the discussion on the identified issues and for the Board to provide direction to Sonoma Water and the consultant team.
